
RRI'S DOT WASTE TRANSPORT FOR DRIVERS / HANDLERS

Syllabus — Course 102

Cost: Call RRI for on-site training costs.

Length: 1 day

Target: Drivers and handlers who meet the definition of hazmat employee (including operations personnel, warehouse personnel, clerical support, etc.) and transport or handle hazardous wastes.

Prerequisite: None.

Intensity: Mild Medium Challenging Extreme

Materials: RRI provides all training materials. Testing and course completion certificate are also provided.

Objectives & Topics:

This workshop is an abbreviated version of the RRI's Course 202. The abbreviated workshop is specifically designed to provide instruction in the Hazardous Materials Regulations and introduction into the RCRA hazardous waste regulations for those personnel who handle and transport non-bulk hazardous wastes. Specific training is not provided on waste designation, classification or packaging selection. The topics covered include acceptable package conditions, package markings, labeling, documentation requirements, vehicle placarding, and acceptable vehicle load configurations. An examination is given at the conclusion of the course.

- ! Define the purpose, scope and applicability of the Hazardous Materials Regulations (HMRs).
- ! Explain how DOT and RCRA classify and identify hazardous wastes.
- ! Identify the types of packagings authorized by the HMRs and the conditions that are acceptable for shipment.
- ! Identify the proper markings required on a given package of hazardous waste.
- ! Identify how and what DOT label(s) must be displayed on a given hazardous waste package.
- ! Identify the entries necessary for a complete Uniform Hazardous Waste Manifest.
- ! Explain the process to determine the specific vehicle placarding requirements.
- ! Explain the requirements for properly loading hazardous waste in vehicles and storage incidental thereto.
- ! Identify the requirements for certain hazardous waste and packaging situations encountered in transport.
- ! Explain the requirements for emergency response notification and reporting and security requirements imposed by the HMRs.
